

Notice of the 112th

RMB VLC NATIONAL SPRINT REGATTA Saturday 26th and Sunday 27th January 2019

**This notice of regatta is an invitation to all rowing clubs
who wish to participate in this sprint regatta**

1. VENUE:

Victoria Lake, Lake Road, Germiston, Johannesburg

2. DATE:

Saturday 26th and Sunday 27th January 2019

3. TIME:

Racing starts at 07h30 on Saturday and Sunday.

4. EVENTS/PARTICIPANTS:

- ❖ The regatta will be run in terms of the relevant rules and laws as published in the RowSA Rules of Racing and in terms of the conditions contained in this notice.
- ❖ Masters racing will be handicapped as per the RowSA Rules of Racing handicap system implemented in 2017.
- ❖ The entering of your club members serves as an acceptance of Indemnity in this regatta, namely that you declare that you accept the rules of entry and that you shall participate in the Victoria Lake Rowing Club Regatta at your own risk and indemnify the Regatta Organizers, Sponsors and Officials of this rowing regatta against any claim of whatsoever nature and howsoever arising, which may result from your club's and your members' participation".
- ❖ All clubs must provide an ID file, with a printed copy of the RowSA ID cards of all their rowers, to Commission Control before the start of the regatta. These files will be used to randomly confirm crews entered for races. Failure to do could result in your crew being issued a yellow card, if they are randomly selected for checking.
- ❖ Any event attracting less than 3 entries from at least 2 different clubs at the time of the draw will be cancelled, and the clubs concerned will be notified of such cancellation.
- ❖ Entries are limited to 3 per club per event. 4th and subsequent entries will be accommodated if there are lanes available, to fill the lanes during the first draw.
- ❖ Races will not be held up due to crew or boat clashes.
- ❖ Composite crews will be permitted, but will not obtain points for the affiliated clubs.

- ❖ Please note that this regatta is a National Senior Sprint Regatta. In the opinion of the regatta organizer, many junior rowers can and should compete for the relevant national titles. Accordingly:
 - There will be no 1st junior (U19A) events; however, rowers who normally row in 1st junior events are encouraged to race in Senior A events.
 - There will be no 2nd junior (U19B) events; however, rowers who normally row in 2nd junior events are encouraged to race in Senior B events.
 - There will be no U16 events; however, rowers who normally row in U16 events are encouraged to race in Senior C events.
 - The recommendations above are not binding - junior men and women can choose in which category they would like to race

5. ENTRY FEES FOR COMPETITORS & SPECTATORS

❖ **Spectators:**

- A non-competing spectator gate entry fee will be R40 for adults and R10 for teenagers and children per day. This includes one program per family.
- Free secure parking is available.

❖ **Competitors:**

- Masters and Senior Club competitors will be charged R40 per rower per race (excluding coxswains).
- Junior clubs (scholars) will be charged R10 per entry per event.

ANY CLUBS WHO HAVE NOT PAID THEIR 2018 ENTRY FEES IN FULL WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO RACE.

6. REGATTA WATER RULES

- ❖ Diagram of The Victoria Lake Rowing Course Regatta Traffic Rules can be found in Annexure D.
- ❖ Each lane is equipped with a rope start buoy. Coaches, please take the time to teach your younger rowers the correct procedure in their use.

6.1 Rowing to the start

- ❖ Competitors proceeding to the start must row westward on the northern shore of the lake;
- ❖ Passing between the pump-house and the shore;
- ❖ Keeping at least 20 meters (one wide lane width) clear of Lane 1 of the racing course; and
- ❖ Must row round the rear (to the North) of the starter's platform at the west end of the lake.

6.3 Warm up area

- ❖ The warm up area is on the south side of lane eight of the rowing course;
- ❖ Competitors wanting to access the warm-up area must row round the back of the starting area, giving way to all crews assembling to start;
- ❖ In doing so they must remain thoroughly aware of the presence of all other competitors;
- ❖ Must give way to all boats assembling to race; and
- ❖ Listen to all instructions from race officials.

6.4 Traffic rules in the warm-up area

- ❖ The warm-up circuit is clockwise and is the only clockwise circuit for rowers on the lake. So initially (while rowing Eastwards) they will be rowing parallel to the racing, and as such:
 - They may not do practice starts;
 - They may not pace racing crews; and
 - They may not enter the racing lanes and must stay at least 30 meters clear of lane 8 which is the most southerly racing lane.
- ❖ All competitors must not cut the warm-up circuit short;
- ❖ Once round the East end of the warm-up circuit, competitors should turn westward and row parallel to the southern shore of the lake;
- ❖ Competitors must maintain at least 30 metres of clear water between their boat and the warm-up circuit;
- ❖ Competitors should beware of a rocky outcrop off the southern shore (approximately 150 metres from the west end of the lake). They should row outside the buoy marking the outcrop;
- ❖ Competitors may practice starts while rowing westwards along the southern shore of the lake;
- ❖ Care should be taken moving from the warm up area into the constricted racing assembly area;
- ❖ Competitors may not cross into racing lanes in front of the start line;
- ❖ Competitors must go around the back of the start line; and
- ❖ Consider the presence of other crews moving into the warm up area.

6.5 Excluded and withdrawing crews

- ❖ Excluded competitors as well as others not racing for other reasons must return to the jetties by rowing Eastwards on the southern side of lane eight of the racing course. In doing so:
 - They must comply with Rule 6.4; and
 - When they get to the east end of the lake, they must row round the east end of the finish line, taking care of boats racing, and proceed to the rowing jetties in the normal way, as if they had been racing.

7. ENTRIES

- ❖ Entries close at 17h00 on Wednesday, 16 January 2019.
- ❖ Entries are to be made exclusively on the internet at www.regatta.co.za.

- ❖ The first draw and competitors list will be published on the website on Saturday 19 January 2019.
- ❖ Late entries will be accepted provided there are available lanes. All changes and/or late additions must be e-mailed to RowSA Administrator (row@rowsa.co.za) and Anne Kilian (akilian@page1marketing.co.za) by 12h00 on Tuesday, 23 January 2019.
- ❖ The final draw will be posted on the website by Thursday, 24 January 2019.

8. ORDER OF EVENTS AND TIME GAPS

- ❖ Club captains' and coaches' attention is drawn to the intervals between races as set out in the draft draw. Crew entries and boat allocation should be planned around these times. The organizers will not be able to delay the published start times of any races to accommodate crew or boat clashes.

9. HEATS & FINALS

- ❖ Heats and finals will only be rowed for MA and WA events:
 - Additional finals may be included if there is enough time in the racing schedule. This will be done at the regatta organizer's discretion.
- ❖ If more than 8 entries are received for a Masters' event, the entries will be divided into heats by age which will be rowed successively. Each heat is a straight final, and the crew recording the highest prognostic speed of each heat will be declared the winner of the heat and awarded the medal(s) accordingly. Trophies, where applicable, will be awarded to the crew recording the highest prognostic speed across all heats in the event.
- ❖ The President of the Jury may combine heats should entries reduce to 8 or less due to withdrawals or scratches.

- ❖ If more than 8 entries are received for senior events other than masters, MA and WA, the entries will be divided by draw into heats, which will be rowed successively. The crew recording the fastest time across all heats will be declared the winner and awarded the medal(s) accordingly.

10. CONTROL COMMISSION

- ❖ Any alterations to entries and/or scratches of crews must be reported to Control Commission at least 1 hour prior to the published start time of the race. Control Commission will refer changes to the President of the Jury and other officials.
- ❖ Lightweight rowers and coxswains for Senior A events must weigh in a maximum of 2 hours and minimum of 1 hour prior to the published start time of their respective events; coxswains must supply their own ballasts if required.
- ❖ Boat weights must comply with RowSA weight constraints.

11. TRAILERS, PARKING AND SECURITY

- ❖ Rowing clubs that are based at VLC are requested to remove their rowing trailers from the premises by Thursday, 24 January 2019 at 15h00. Trailers may be returned on Sunday, 27 January 2019 after 16h00.
- ❖ Cars will not be allowed to park or drop off rowers on the VLC premises. Spectators, officials, competitors and coaches are requested to park across the road. Only towing vehicles and vehicles with permits are allowed onto the VLC grounds for the duration of the regatta.
- ❖ A car with a roof rack and scull is not considered a tow vehicle and should be parked across the road.
- ❖ A secure parking area has been arranged across the road from VLC. Parking is free.
- ❖ Areas allocated for trailer parking and boat rigging will be distributed to all visiting clubs and/or schools one (1) week prior to the regatta. Please advise Anne Kilian (akilian@page1marketing.co.za) if your trailer will be arriving at VLC on or before Friday 25 January. Trailer parking in the canoeing area will be organized on a first come first serve basis.
- ❖ Security will be provided from the 16h00 on Friday afternoon until 16h00 on Sunday afternoon. All visiting clubs are reminded that they need to make their own insurance arrangements and that the Victoria Lake Rowing Club will not accept liability for any loss or damage to equipment on our premises.

12. FOOD, REFRESHMENTS AND LIQUOR

- ❖ Food and refreshments will be available throughout the day.
- ❖ The Club restaurant is fully licensed and therefore **NO LIQUOR may be brought onto VLC premises**. The Club's bar facilities will be available for the purchase of refreshments for the duration of the regatta. Drinks (cold) can be ordered in advance, from the Club Manager, 011 825 3530 or 011 873 9300 and can be collected, with ice, on the day for consumption at your picnic site.
- ❖ The Regatta Organizing Committee would appreciate it if you could remind your club members and supporters of the restrictions on liquor at VLC premises.

13. POINTS FOR FLOATING TROPHIES

- ❖ Points will be awarded according to the points table in Annexure C.
- ❖ The floating trophies for the regatta are as follows:

Donoratica Trophy

Senior clubs and universities will receive points for medal positions for the overall race in any of the Men's and or Women's Senior A, B and C events.

Ian MacGregor Trophy

School and junior clubs will receive points for medal positions for the overall race in any of the Senior A, B and/or C events.

Keith Maybery Trophy

Schools and junior clubs will receive points for medal positions achieved in any of the U14A and/or U15A events.

Selwyn Tucker Plate

Masters will receive points for the 1st 3 **overall** places within an **Event** (best 3 prognostic speeds across all heats of an event) for all Master's 1st and 2nd Division events.

VLC Rowing Cup for Girls

School and junior clubs will receive points for medal positions for the overall race in any of the girls' Junior and Senior A, B and/or C events.

VLC Rowing Cup for Boys

School and junior clubs will receive points for medal positions for the overall race in any of the boys Junior and Senior A, B and/or C events.

Allan Francis Trophy

Most number of points received by a co-ed school for medal positions for the overall race in any of the boys and girls Junior and Senior A, B and/or C events.

VLC Rowing Cup for Masters

Masters will receive points for medal positions achieved in any master's event.

Winners of the abovementioned floating trophies are determined using the following points system:

- To obtain maximum points in an event, a final must compose of a minimum of four participating boats, from at least two different clubs.
- In the event of a three-boat final with boats from at least two different clubs, the first two places will receive points equivalent to second and third places, for example, 12 points for 1st place and 6 points for 2nd in a Senior A 1X event.
- No points will be awarded when there is a row-over.

- ❖ Medals will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places for all events, except for Masters where each heat is considered a final and medals will be awarded accordingly.

14. PRIZE GIVING

- ❖ Competitors will be awarded medals after their races at the Regatta Office.
- ❖ Floating trophy presentations will be made after the final event on Sunday 26th January 2019.

The Victoria Lake Rowing Club, VLC Watersport Institute and the Regatta Organizing Committee look forward to your company at what we trust will be a most enjoyable and successful regatta. Please encourage as many non-rowers as possible to attend the event and see South African rowing at its best.
